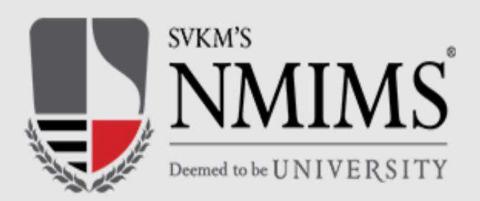

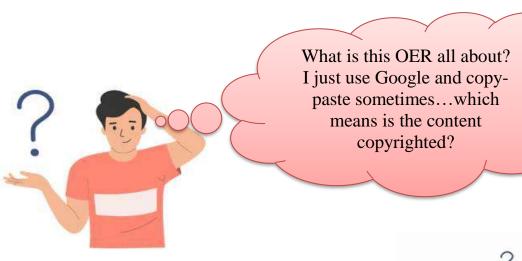

Defining Openaccess Educational Resources

KNOWING PRECISELY WHAT IS KNOWN AS -



OER are teaching, learning, and research resources that reside in the public domain or have been released under an intellectual property license that permits their free use and repurposing by others.

Open educational resources include complete courses, course materials, modules, textbooks, streaming videos, tests, software, and other tools, materials, or techniques used to support access to knowledge.

The essence of these Open Education Resources is that anybody can freely access, copy, share, and save them for future endeavours.

The key distinguishing factor is the copyright status of the material. If the course content is copyrighted under traditional all-rights-reserved copyright, then it's not OER. If it resides in the public domain or carries Creative Commons or similar open copyright status, then it is OER.

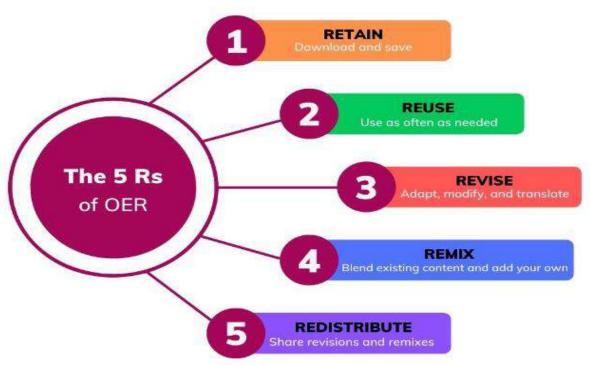
Understanding more about OERs

Learning resources are significant in an academic environment, as they help students and teachers learn and teach in an organised and effective technique. Previously, only printed materials were available for teachers to teach and students to learn and indulge in research activities. Now, in a technologically advanced environment, Pioneering teaching-learning resources are abundant on the internet. Open Education Resources are resources available on the internet.

Now a day, knowledge in the form of data is easily accessible in diverse conditions. Both students and teachers extensively use these forms in several ways and at many times, as these are not perishable easily but are reusable at unlimited times. These resources are nothing but Open Education Resources, as they are available to anybody at any given time of the day with ease of access at anyone's convenience.

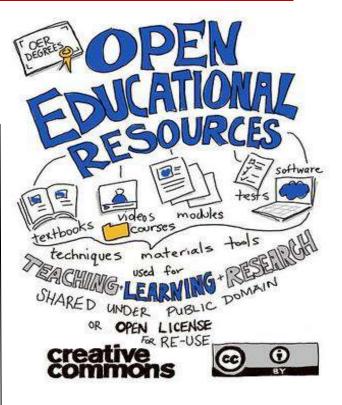
Nature of OERs

Nature: The nature of Open Education Resources is formed to facilitate the following five R's to cater for the needs of users of Open Education Resources; these five R's are:

- Reuse Content can be reused in its unaltered original format the right to use the content in a wide range of ways (e.g., in a class, in a study group, on a website, in a video)
- ➤ Retain Copies of content can be retained for personal archives or reference the right to make, own, and control copies of the content (e.g., download, duplicate, store, and manage)
- ➤ Revise Content can be modified or altered to suit specific needs the right to adapt, adjust, modify, or change the content itself (e.g., translate the content into another language)
- ➤ Remix Content can be adapted with other similar content to create something new the right to combine the original or revised content with other material to create something new (e.g., incorporate the content into a mashup)
- ➤ Redistribute Content can be shared with anyone else in its original or altered format the right to share copies of the original content, your revisions, or your remixes with others (e.g., give a copy of the content to a friend)



BENEFITS OF OPEN-ACCESS EDUCATIONAL RESOURCES (OER)

1. Free access to educational resources

• OERs enable customers to have free access to a wide range of content.

2. Access anytime, anywhere

 Users are not required to be present at any location to use these resources; they may be accessed at any time and from any location, making it easy for everyone.

3. Support independent learners

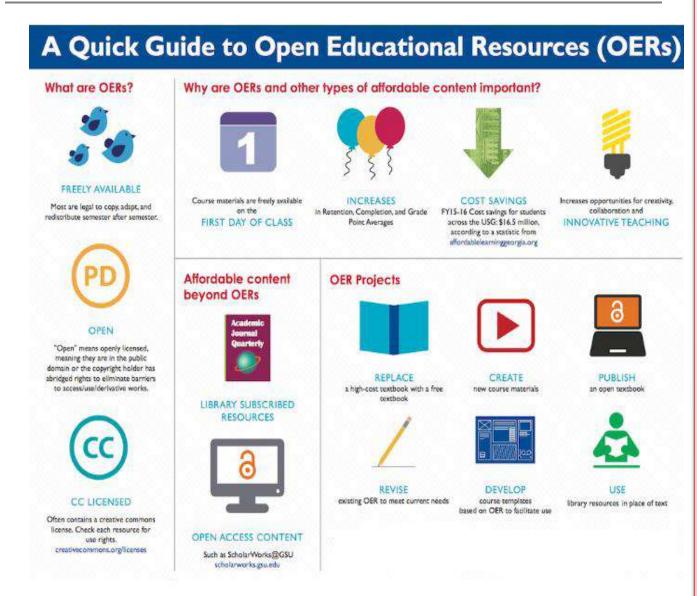
• With regard to OER, learners are no longer reliant on someone to offer materials because they may search online and access them independently.

4. Content Reusable

• OERs enable users to reproduce information under certain conditions, but they can be utilised for educational purposes.

Where do I find Open- Access Resources?

The open-access materials are suitable in front of us, yet we occasionally miss them because we are unfamiliar with the databases. The OERs listed below might be helpful to all faculties and students for accessing and learning more about resources.

4 E-books Resources

Open Access books are eBooks that are free to access and which are free of most copyright and licensing restrictions.

Directory of Open Access Books –

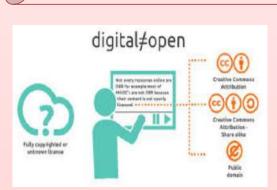
The Directory of Open Access Books (DOAB) is a community-driven discovery service that indexes and provides access to scholarly, peer-reviewed Open Access books.

► <u>Hathi Trust Digital Library</u> –

The Hathi Trust Digital Library is a partnership of academic and research institutions, offering a collection of millions of titles digitised from libraries worldwide.

> Open Research Library -

Open Research Library (ORL) is a collection of peer-reviewed, Open Access scholarly monographs. ORL offers access to more than 14,000 Open Access books.



Open-Access Course Resources

> Open Textbook Library

Open textbooks are free to use and distribute and are licensed by authors and publishers to be freely adapted or changed with proper attribution. The Open Textbook Library currently contains over 880 Open textbooks.

▶ Open Stax

Open Stax provides access to peerreviewed, openly licensed free textbooks across a wide range of disciplines including mathematics, humanities, business and social sciences.

OER Commons

A growing collection of Open Educational Resources that you can navigate by subject area, material type or curated collections. It currently contains over 50,000 high quality Open Educational Resources.

> MIT Open Courseware

MIT Open Courseware (OCW) is a web-based publication of nearly all MIT course content. All OCW materials are openly available.

> Open Yale Courses

Open Yale Courses (OYC) provides lectures and other materials from selected Yale courses to the public, free of charge. The courses range across disciplines including liberal arts, humanities, social sciences and physical and biological sciences.

> OAPEN Library -

The OAPEN library contains a quality-controlled collection of hundreds of Open Access books.

4 E-Journals Resources

▶ Directory of Open Access Journals (DOAJ)

DOAJ is a community-curated online directory that indexes and provides access to high-quality, Open Access, peer-reviewed journals.

> Science Direct open-access journals

Science Direct provides open access to selected journals. The articles in open-access journals which Elsevier publishes have undergone peer review and, upon acceptance, are immediately and permanently free for everyone to read and download.

≻ CORE –

Aggregates content from the repositories of many higher education and research organisations.

▶ The Bielefeld Academic Search Engine (BASE) —

Indexes freely available publications from global repositories. It allows multilingual searches, and results can be refined using a wide range of parameters, including Dewey classification, language, document type and year of publication.

Europe PubMed Central –

Provides access to life sciences articles, books, patents and clinical guidelines. It is the recommended repository for many research funders.

L-Thesis/Dissertation Resources

> ShodhGanga

Shodhganga is an Open Access Repository of full-text theses submitted to universities in India. Membership is not required to browse, view, search and download the thesis available in Shodhganga.

EBSCO Open Dissertations

This is a free database with records for more than 1.4 million electronic theses and dissertations from more than 320 universities worldwide.

Open Access Theses and Dissertations

You can search for Open Access theses and dissertations from around the world. OATD includes nearly 6 million thesis records and dissertations from 1100 universities and research institutes.

> Open Image Resources

> Pexels

Pexels is a website that offers images and videos that are free to be downloaded and used. All materials are made available under the custom Pexels licenses.

OPEN-ACCESS TOOLS - PLUG-INS

> **Unpaywall**

This is a free browser extension tool that you can use to find Open Access versions of paywalled research papers. It is available for Chrome and Firefox. It helps you to source free, legal, full-text research papers, as you browse online.



> CORE DISCOVERY

CORE Discovery claims to have the best coverage of material available in Open Access repositories. If the paper you're looking for isn't openly available, then CORE will suggest other papers on the same topic that are available Open Access.



> Open Access Helper for iOS

If you are an iOS user, you can use OA Helper to search for Open Access articles across a range of devices (including iPad, iPod Touch, and iPhone) without hitting a paywall. You can download the OA Helper from the Apple Store.



Drawbacks of OERs



As with any educational resource, there have advantages and disadvantages associated with using OERs. We have seen detailed information about benefits, nature and how these work. Further, we have also seen the different types of open-access resources available to us. But, like print and e-resources have their pros and cons. Similarly, open-access resources are also accessible and suitable to use, but they also have certain drawbacks, which are listed as follows –

- Issues of Quality: As so many depositories permit anyone to construct an account and subsequently permit to post that material, many of the resources would become irrelevant and Inaccurate
- Absence of Reciprocal Activities: In Open Education Resources platforms, there is always an absence of face-to-face social interactions. This absence will sometimes lead to monotonous and Unemotional teaching-learning Scenarios.
- **Barriers of Languages and Cultures**: Most Open Education Resources are available only in English, limiting their uses to only English-understanding areas of the globe. As well as not all resources are culturally suitable to every user.
- **Technical Barriers**: Slow or unreliable internet connections and costly soft wares will hinder a user from accessing Open Education Resources correctly.
- ➤ Inert Designs: Some Open Education Resources are sometimes designed so that it will become highly impossible for users to access, modify or download the contents.
- **Copyright Issues**: Contents of Open Education Resources are fashioned to be shared flexibly, sometimes leading to unethical modifications or misuse of the contents.
- Additional Energy is mandatory to Implement Open Education Resources: Implementing Open Education Resources in academic circles encompasses extra efforts to the handlers of Open Education Resources. These handlers include Designers, Faculty, Digital Rights Specialists, editors and other related people to maintain Open Education Resources.



Evaluation Criteria of OERs

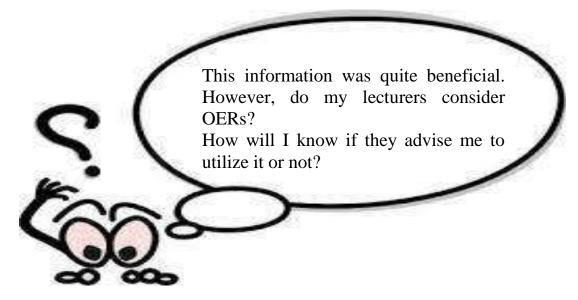
OERs may vary in quality; we must evaluate them before using them.

Criteria to consider may include the following:

- **Authority:** Is it clear who developed and wrote the material? Are their qualifications for creating the material clearly stated?
- Accuracy: Are there errors or omissions visible?
- **Objectivity:** Is any type of bias present?
- Currency: Is the resource up-to-date, and is a creation or update date visible?
- Coverage: Does it address the topic at hand sufficiently to add value to the class? Does only a portion of it apply? Do you need to combine it with other resources? Can you align each resource with your syllabus's learning objectives and weekly lessons to identify gaps?
- Accessibility: Is it ADA-compliant? (Instructors planning to use OERs in their classrooms should also keep in mind that the OERs should comply with federal and state accessibility requirements)
- License: Has a Creative Commons License been applied? Can you remix or reuse the item? Who do you have to attribute copyright to, if anyone?
- **Persistence:** Before using an OER, you must check whether the URL is valid and whether the OER has been updated since you last accessed it.



Open Education Resources are the need of the hour, as the maximum number of students, teachers, and researchers opt for e-versions for their day-to-day academic activities. These educational activities include reading, teaching, spreading knowledge, and saving resources for the upcoming generation.



NMIMS Faculty views on OERs!!

> DISPELLING SOME MISCONCEPTIONS ABOUT OPEN EDUCATIONAL RESOURCES (OER)

Open Educational Resources (OER), as defined by UNESCO, is an expansive collection of learning, teaching, and research materials accessible in varied formats and mediums, existing freely in the public domain or under open copyright licenses. The defining characteristic of OER is their permission for no-cost access, reuse, adaptation, and redistribution by others.

(Open Educational Resources | UNESCO)

A closer understanding of this definition allows us to counter some common misapprehensions about OER. First, the term 'materials' extends beyond formalised course-related content. In addition, the concept 'in any format and medium' implies that OERs can exist in various formats—not just digital—and their access is not limited to internet resources. Next, while OERs may reside in the public domain—offering free accessibility, unrestricted use, and adherence to copyright laws to all—they can also fall under copyright. In such cases, the author's rights on the resource are openly released for communal usage. Thirdly, it is a misconception that all digital content can be categorised as OER. Only materials issued under open licenses, such as Creative Commons, qualify as OER. This distinguishes OER from freely available online materials that may not be openly licensed. Fourthly, 'no-cost access' relates to financial ease of access and should not be misconstrued as an indicator of low-quality resources. Finally, the permissions for use, re-purpose, adaptation, and redistribution by others transcend monetary considerations, symbolising freedom from intellectual property restrictions. Most OERs are safeguarded by open licenses like Creative Commons, granting users the rights to use, share, modify, and redistribute the content while attributing the original author. This liberty paves the way for educators and learners to customise resources to local contexts and individual learning styles, fostering creativity, innovation, and collaboration in education.

> OPEN-EDUCATIONAL RESOURCES

Open Educational Resources (OERs) are the data/information available on the internet in the public domain for individuals to learn from. The driving factor was to enable individuals with accessible information, primarily initiated by MIT. The OERs are made available by educational firms and open licensing firms, UNESCO, Wikipedia, freelancers, blogs, Quora and social networking firms. However, OERs have their pros and cons. One of the advantages is that the content is ever-evolving and can assist individuals with the latest information compared to textbooks that might contain outdated knowledge. One of the disadvantages is the conflict between authenticity and verification of genuine information.

The free resources are often unverified and unscientific. There are barely any statistical backing or experimental/pilot project results, and hence can't always be trusted. It becomes the duty of the individual to collect, study and verify information from multiple OERs to form an opinion and confidence on any topic. An individual's intellect and consciousness shall dictate whether the info is humane, relevant, and applicable. The most prominent example is Google or to search over YouTube to find symptoms, duration, and remedies for an illness. The information received is non-specific and untrustworthy. There comes the necessity for a practised doctor who has monitored hundreds or thousands of patients and treated them best. He has finally achieved the wisdom to differentiate between minor and terminal illnesses. Therefore, he charges a minimal fee for the remedy.

In the era of free knowledge banks, artificial intelligence (AI) portals, and technical manipulation tools, one shall be cautious about using them. The individual with some knowledge and wisdom will be able to observe that the information received has no evident/peer-review sources. Hence, it cannot be utilised to solve a specific problem. Thus, I believe the portal that charges a minimal or a nominal fee from the customer in return for knowledge will hold better validation and trust than any open educational resource.

One of the strategies for the institutions has been to agree or have a contract with the knowledge portals to provide access to students and faculty with some overall fee. Secondly, to take the students into the work environment based on interviews and then train them in a particular skill. Next is the industry-academia connection, where both organisations hold some expertise to share. A few examples of industry-academia connect are to check the achievability of environmental, social, and governance goals between theory and practice—an adaption of implementable procedures to achieve ecological and business sustainability. The last one is the interdepartmental approach among the fraternity, where experts from different domains such as strategy, finance, marketing, human resources, and operations share ideas, turn them into wholesome concepts, and finally practice. Such teaching could serve the students with a multidimensional view to apply.

Here are some of the common questions answered about the Library 😊 😊

1. Where can I get daily news and the latest information about my interest/field?

Ans – The Library holds a variety of print and online journals to get market information. As well as you can update yourself with the latest information by visiting the Library and reading various Newspapers on a daily basis.

2. How do I check Titles/Books available in the Library?

Ans - The library collections are fully searchable using the NMIMS Online Catalog of the combined collections. Also, under this section, you can log in to your Library account using your credentials to check the books issued by you earlier.

3. How can I access/log in to the E-Library?

Ans- You can access the E-Library using NMIMS e-Library Link, click on Login, Select the LDAP option on the left, and enter your login credentials, don't forget to enter the captcha before signing in...

For faculties/staff -

The username and password would be the same as their office outlook credentials.

For Students -

Username - SAPID@svkmgrp.com

Password – Wi-Fi password given by the institution.

4. Where can I access Harvard Business Review Journals?

Ans – The Harvard publication is available in full- text from 1922 to the present through the EBSCO database. Under the EBSCO database, you can click on (the third option from the top left) "Publications, and choose Business Source Premier – Publications" (From the dropdown); similarly, you can access the journals directly (if the publication is known) from our various e-journal databases like EBSCO and ProQuest.

5. How do I find which database is suitable for finding the desired information?

Ans- A Quick usage guide is available under the Library Resources tab on the student portal; referring to the manual will guide you to the correct database.

6. Where can I find Last Year's Questions papers?

Ans – In the student portal, you can refer to the "Library Documents" tab for all the previous years' question papers.

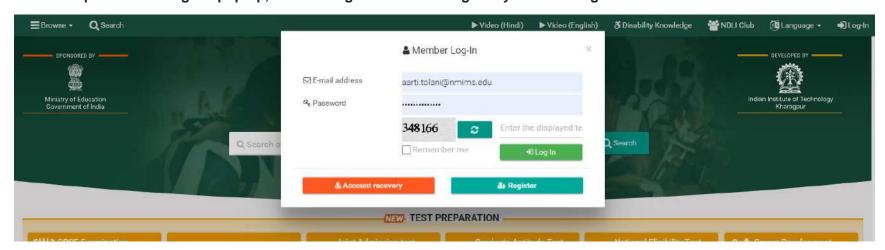
As the students begin their first year of their MBA, they must register with several portals and websites. The following is a tutorial for students to help them register and access everything by following easy steps.

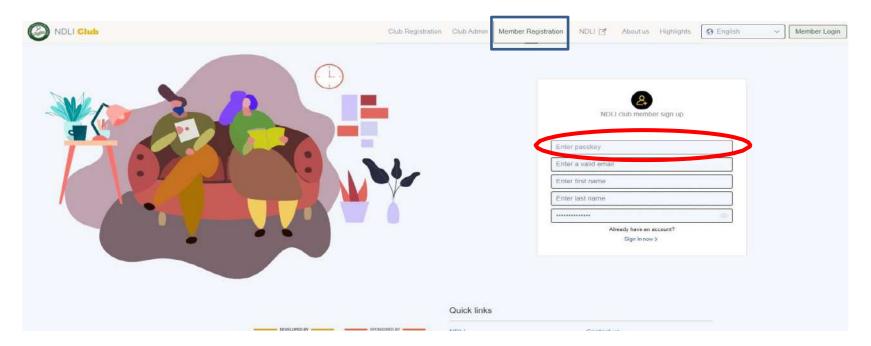

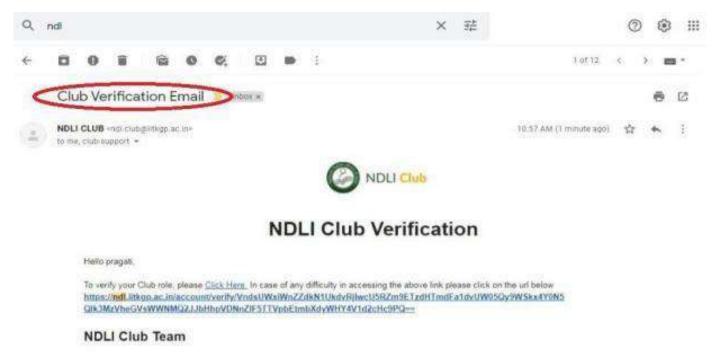

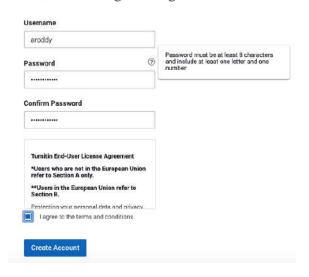

SETTING UP TURNITIN ACCOUNT

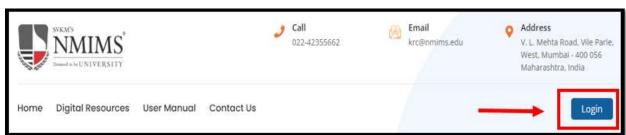
- 1. Check your email inbox for a welcome email from noreply@turnitin.com
- 2. In the welcome email, click the **Activate my Account** button. This will take you to the login screen. **Please activate your account** within 7 days after receiving the account activation link. After that, the link will get expire.
- 3. On the login screen, choose your username. Your username can be the same as your email.
- 4. Next, choose your password and confirm it. Passwords must have the following:
 - 1. At least 8 characters
- 2. At least 1 letter
- 3. At least 1 number
- 5. Then, read through and agree to the Turnitin End-User License Agreement.



- 6. Select the Create Account button. Once you do, you'll be taken into your account.

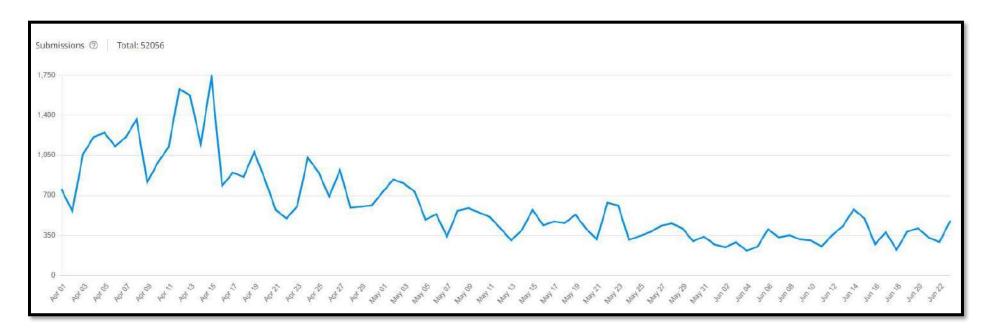

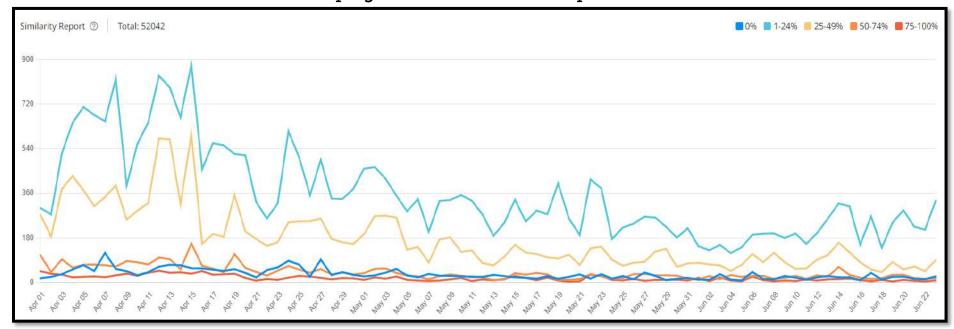


TURNITIN USAGE OF THE QUARTER

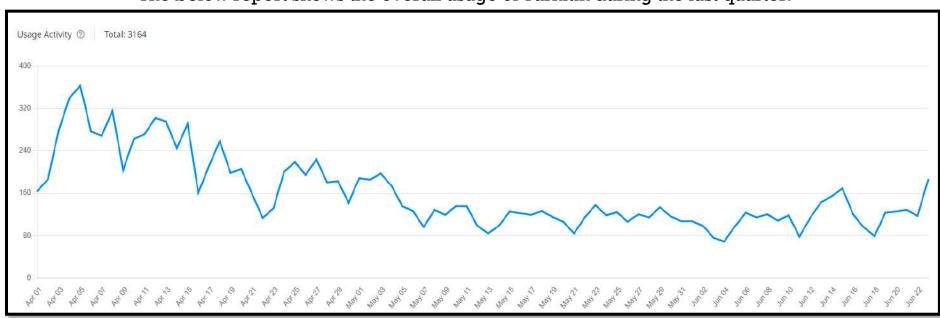
The below report states the number of users who have checked their work for plagiarism using Turnitin software in the last quarter.

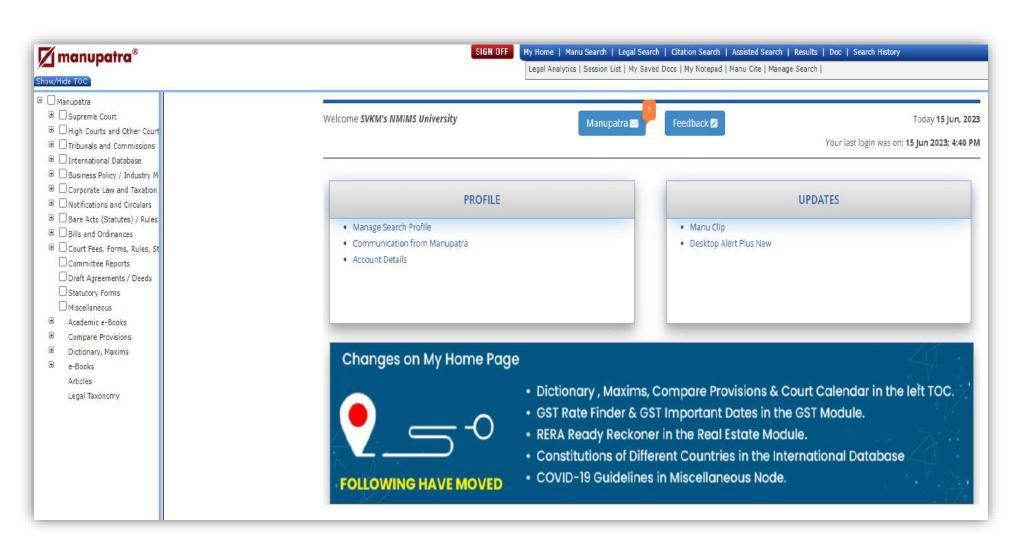

Fig 1: Shows tab of manupatra under Law Databases after successful login from Mapmyaccess



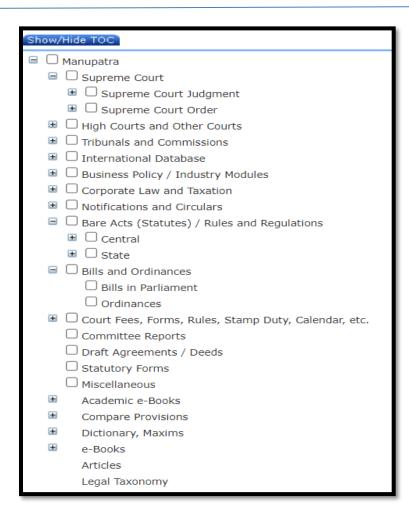
GETTING STARTED WITH THE DATABASE -

Legal Search — The field Search interface allows you to search for Judgments on Act, Case Notes, Appellant/Respondent/Judge Name, Date, Subject, Sub-Subject and Citations



- 1. Manu Search Word and phrase search interfaces provide Simple, Boolean and Proximity Search flexibility.
- <u>2. Legal Search</u> Field Search interfaces allow you to search for Judgments on Acts, Case Notes, Appellant/Respondent/Judge Name, Date, Subject, Sub-Subject and Citations.
- 3. Citation Search Allows you to search case laws/Judgments through the Citation of various Journals.
- 4. <u>Assisted Search</u> The user needs to input the Query in the box of choice [5 options to select from] and get to their Relevant Results
- <u>5.</u> <u>Results</u> This shows you the list of the last search results. (If you click once on any search interface the previous search, results cannot be viewed).
- **<u>6.</u> <u>Doc</u>** takes you to the last document viewed.
- <u>7. Search History</u> shows the list of the last 20 searches you did. Select from the list and view the search results instead of typing your Query again.
- 8. Analytics is a graphical analysis of judgments through search Analytics/Judge Analytics. Judge Analytics gives the analytics of judgments written by the Hon'ble judges of the Supreme Court& Delhi High Court (other courts coming soon).
- <u>9. Session List</u> is valid only for the duration of the current session. Add documents to the session list for further action of Email, Print and save. Once you sign off from the session, the list ceases to exist.
- 10. My Saved Docs here, you can view the saved documents; these can be saved in different folders.
- 11. My Notepad to create notes for different documents and add them to your list for future viewing.
- 12. Manu Cite a gear like the one icon is shown beside every manu id mentioned/linked in a document; manu cite, when clicked, displays the number of times the judgment has been cited in other judgments. The treatment of the subject case in other cases is also depicted. When clicked from the top bar, Manu Cite displays a sorted view of all the manu mentioned in the selected judgment, along with their cited count and treatment in other cases.
- 13. Manage Search —To access your saved searches, Click on Manage Search; you can view all saved searches and click on the search to open/edit/delete/set an alert

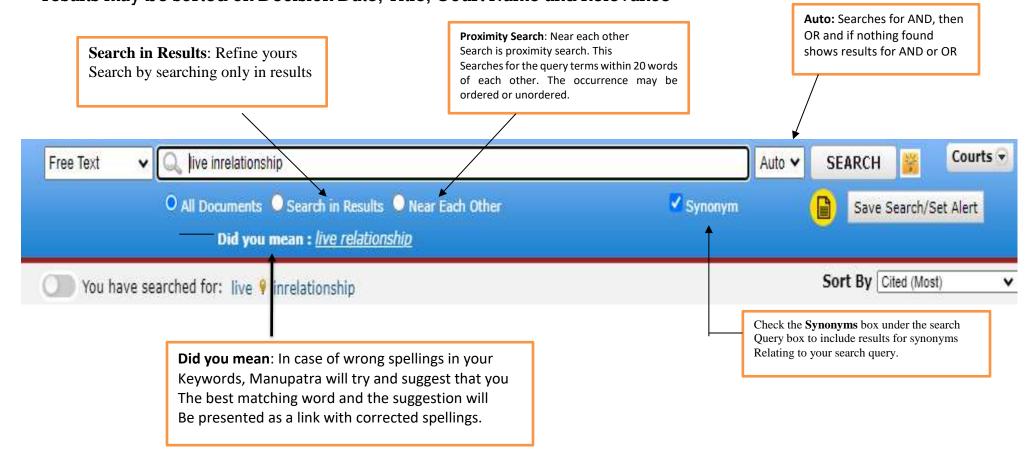

1. Manu Search

This interface gives you the single search box experience and assists you in searching for keywords, phrases, multiple phrases and more. You can perform a Boolean search using Manu Search.

Type in your Query, and the search engine uses back-end algorithms to give results based on relevancy. The results may be sorted on Decision Date, Title, Court Name and Relevance

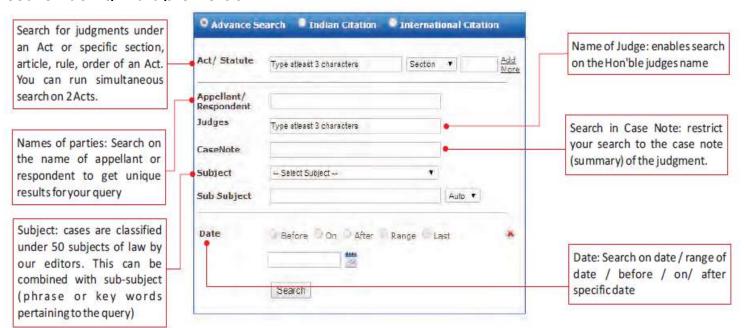

Field Search

Adding a field restriction to your search is useful when searching for specific cases by name and for documents from a specific year, judge or court.

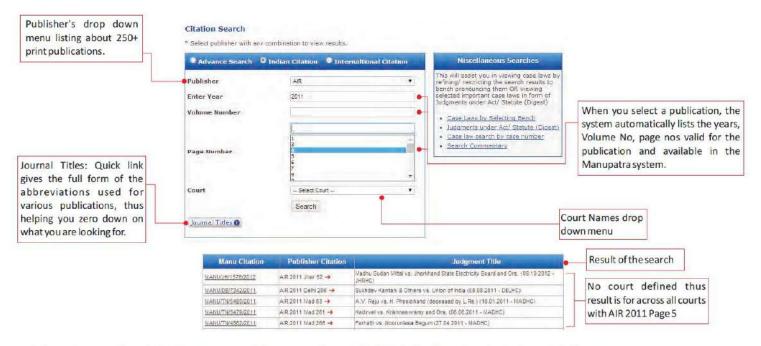

3. Citation Search

Manupatra has a powerful and in-depth Citation search. Specifying all components of the citation gets you unique results; inputting partial information of a citation also gets you results, which helps you identify the relevant document with no extra effort.

4. Assisted Search

- > This search enables the Manu to search to be more precise without Double quotes, AND, OR, and Proximity parameters.
- > Therefore, you can frame your Query and can type the Query in the desired search field; it will bring results accordingly. The entire search field is connected with the AND operator by default; it will only bring results from documents if all query parameters are found in a document.
- E.g., Child custody alimony, when searched as a phrase, gives you 31 results; when searched in the proximity of two words of each, the other gives 526 results.

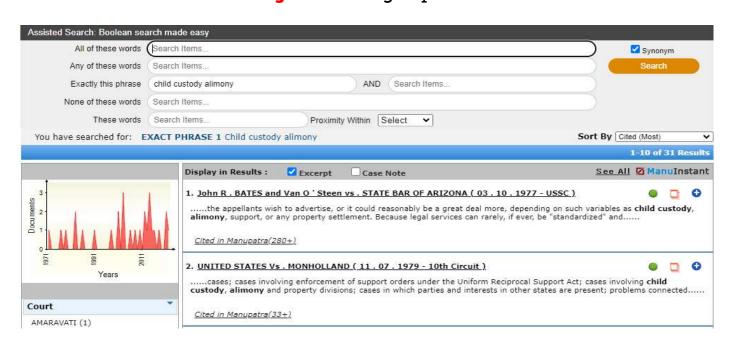


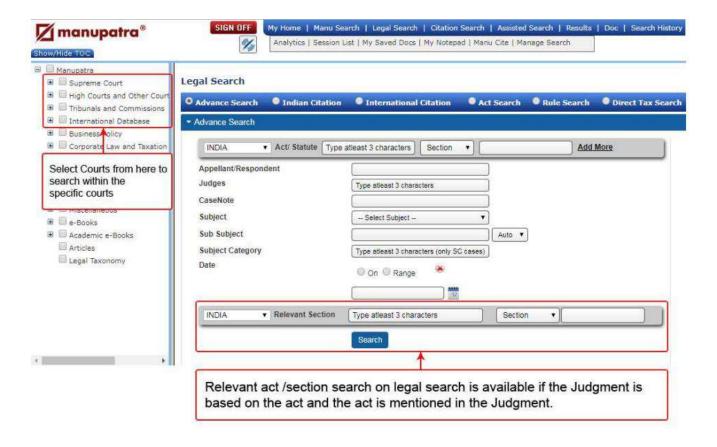
Fig.1 Searching as phrase

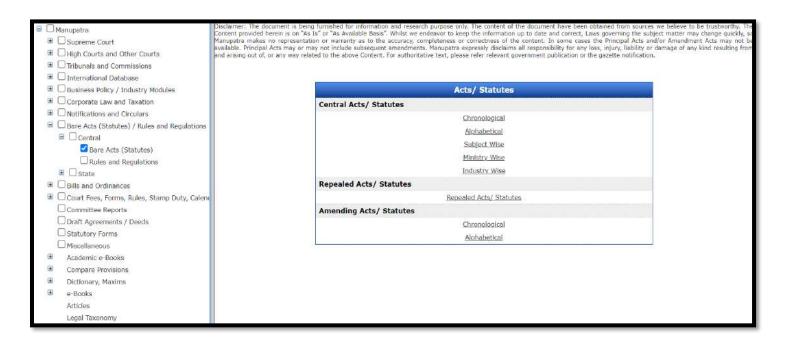

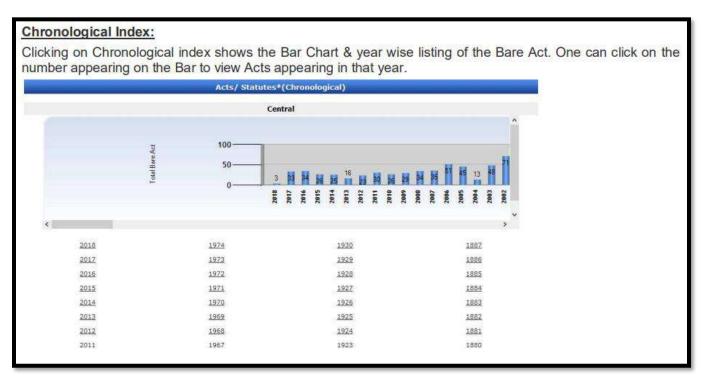

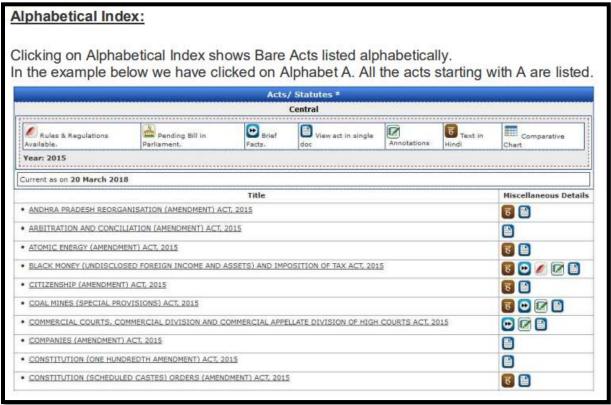
